HUNGARIAN INDUSTRIAL POLICY: DEPARTURE FROM THE POST-SOCIALIST GROWTH MODEL?

In the wake of the 1990s economic transformation, countries of the former Eastern Bloc embarked on a development strategy characterized by FDI dependence, export-driven growth and competitiveness based on cheap labour. However, in recent years two things are becoming obvious: the post-socialist strategy is becoming exhausted, and there is an urgent need for a new developmental path.

Meanwhile industrial policy is making a comeback to relevancy, offering new instruments of growth, as well as new paradigm for understanding the role of state in economic development. In post-socialist Europe, Hungary is at the forefront of this change, employing increasingly interventionist economic policy. What are its particular aspects and can we view Hungarian industrial policy as a full departure from the post-socialist growth model onto a new developmental path?
